UrbanFood^{Plus} is a multi-disciplinary network of German, African, and international scientists, private sector representatives, and stakeholders which aims at developing site-specific, farmer-tailored innovations for improved agricultural production, food safety, and value chains in four major West African cities (Ouagadougou, Burkina Faso; Tamale, Ghana; Bamako, Mali and Bamenda, Cameroon). The position cannot be shared. Main place of service is Göttingen, regular field work in Africa for several months per year will be required. Fitness for service in the tropics is therefore mandatory.

The flow of resources and of commodities in West African urban and peri-urban agriculture (UPA) depends on social and political institutions (both formal as well as informal) and processes of socio-political interaction comprising various categories and groups of actors. They also depend on technologies and procedures (e.g. for nutrient provision or irrigation) that will be analyzed as integral components of urban farmers' and livestock raisers' social systems. The anthropological study of UPA contributes to a better understanding of social, political and cultural factors that affect agricultural potentials and decision-making processes. It also informs and supports the participatory process of developing enhanced technical solutions as in herd, water or soil management.

Your responsibilities:

- Research on the access to resource flows concerning farming and/or livestock production, on technology use and innovation in UPA
- Contributing to a participatory appraisal of urban and peri-urban farming households
- Organizing and upholding a close dialogue among stakeholders and within the project team
- Supervising Master students during their field work and in overall data processing
- Contributing to the extension activities in close collaboration with the international and local partners and to organizing local and international workshops
